Q-C company buys Mama Bosso Pizza

American Food Styles LLC has bought the assets of RCM Smith Inc., manufacturers of Rock Island-based Mama Bosso Pizza, and plans to hire 24 new employees in the next two years.

AFS founder Scott Florence, of Bettendorf, said the company dedicated to owning, consulting and buying food brands focused on authentic food styles.

"Ninety-five percent of Americans eat pizza once a week, and frozen pizza is especially popular here in the upper Midwest," said Mr. Florence, who is keeping the pizza recipe while expanding to new markets.

"Our plans are to hire 24 new employees in the next 24 months, bringing our workforce to 36. We're also looking at upgrading packaging and adding new varieties of pizza including Mexican, barbecue chicken and Hawaiian flavors."

Mama Bosso Pizza founder John Bosso originally served homemade pizza to the patrons of his Moline restaurant / tavern, which he ran from 1962-1980. He started a carryout/delivery business in 1985, and with his daughters Tracey and Mary added the frozen pizza business in 1987. After 16 years the Bosso family sold the business in 2003 to Randy and Christine Smith of RCM Smith Inc.

RCM Smith expanded distribution west to Des Moines and north into Wisconsin.

AFS obtained capital investment financing through the Bi-State Regional Commission and Rock Island's Commercial Industrial Revolving Loan Fund and Quad City Bank & Trust.

Before founding AFS, Mr. Florence was president and CEO of Hill & Valley Bakery Co. (formerly Nancy's Pies) and has extensive food manufacturing experience.
